PREREQUISITES: Mathematics 4123 or equivalent, or permission of the instructor.

COURSE OUTLINE: This course has two purposes: introduce certain important classes of commutative rings that appear in algebraic number theory and algebraic geometry, and introduce techniques to study these rings as local geometric objects (affine schemes). Topics: an introduction to the theory of commutative rings. Prime spectrum, localization, Noetherian rings, integral extensions, Hilbert's vanishing theorem, Dedekind rings, completion, dimension theory, sheaves.

EVALUATION OF STUDENT PERFORMANCE:

- 1. Regular assignments worth 50% of the final grade. There will be 4 sets of assignments chosen from the text, with about 5 problems in each set.
- 2. A term assignment worth 25% of the final grade.
- 3. A two-hour final exam worth 25% of the final grade.

TIME and PLACE: May 1-July 7, 4 hours per week.
