Course Outline: We will extend differential calculus from the single variable to the multivariable setting. This will require some basic linear algebra, which we will review at the beginning of the course. Roughly, the course will cover chapters 12–14 of the textbook. Here is an approximate list of topics:

Three dimensional analytic geometry: dot and cross product; equations for lines and planes; quadric surfaces; vector functions and space curves; arc length; curvature; velocity; acceleration.

Differential calculus of functions of several variables: level curves and surfaces; limits; continuity; partial derivatives; tangent planes; differentials; chain rule; implicit functions; extrema; Lagrange multipliers.

Evaluation: The course mark will be based on 10 weekly *in-class* quizzes (10 min. each), 2 term tests, and the final exam, with the following weights:

• Best 8 out of 10 quizzes: 24%

Term tests: 36%
Final exam: 40%.

Examination Dates: The term tests will be held in class on Wednesday, October 12, and Wednesday, November 9, 2016. The final examination will be scheduled by the Registrar.

Problem Sets: The problem sets will be assigned weekly. These will not be submitted for marking. However, they are essential to the understanding of the material and preparation for the quizzes and tests.

Quizzes: The quizzes will be based on the material of the recently assigned problem sets.

What is Expected of the Student: Students are expected to learn the material of the appropriate sections of Chapters 12-14 and to complete the assigned practice problems.

Students that work at a consistent pace throughout the term (and do not put off asking questions until exam time), use help resources available (e.g., the Help Centre), and do self-directed exploration of topics, tend to achieve better results in university-level mathematics courses.
