EVALUATION OF STUDENT PERFORMANCE:

Students will be assessed on the basis of three components: two Midterms and a Final Exam.

Midterm 1,	Tuesday July 4, from 7:00 to 8:30 in class.	25%
Midterm 2,	Thursday July 20 from 7:00 to 8:30 in class.	25%
Final Exam,	Tuesday August 1	50%

The final mark for the course will be the best of the calculated mark 25%+25%+50% and Final exam out of 100%. The Final Exam will be 3 hours in length, covering all of the course material. This exam will be scheduled by the Registrar's Office during the Summer Evening Exam Period.

Notes: NO calculators or other electronic devices or any other aids are allowed on tests and exams.

Homework: Weekly recommended Homework is posted on the course website. They will not be collected and not marked. However it is important to do the them to be familiar with the curse materials.

Help Centers: There are weekly help centers which help students to answer their questions. They are every Tuesday and Thursday from 4:00 to 6:00 PM at MC 108. These help centers starts from June 27 and ends on Thursday July 27.

COURSE OUTLINE:

Topics covered include techniques of counting, probability, discrete and continuous random variables. Students are expected to demonstrate an understanding of these concepts and an ability to apply them in solving a variety of problems.
