Course Description.

Matrix algebra including vectors and matrices, linear equations, determinants.

This course is intended primarily for students in the Social Sciences, but may meet minimum requirements for some Science modules.

OWL.

Various supplementary materials, such as videos, practice tests and solutions, are posted on the course OWL web site. In addition, there are forums on which students may post questions. Important information will also be posted on OWL. All students are expected to be aware of the information, and make use of materials, posted on the course web site. This section uses the online quizzes as the class work component of the grade.

What is expected of the student.

Students should read the textbook and the lecture notes, watch the videos and make a serious effort to understand all course materials and do all the assigned homework. It is up to the student to seek out help when needed. The student is responsible for being aware of all relevant information posted on the OWL web site.

Evaluation of Student Performance.

Quizzes. There will be online quizzes, approximately one per week. They are worth 25% of the final grade.

Midterm Examination. One midterm exam, worth 25% of the final grade. It will be a mix of multiple choice and written answers.

Final Examination. The final exam will be 3 hours long and account for 50% of the final grade. It will be a mix of multiple choice and written answers.
