PREREQUISITES: Calculus 1500A/B or Calculus 1000A/B, with a minimum mark of 55%, or by permission of the instructor.

COURSE OUTLINE: We cover techniques of integration, improper integrals, differential equation, sequences and series, power series, parametric equations and polar coordinates. This approximately corresponds to Chapters 3 – 7 of the textbook.

FEEDBACK: This summer course is extremely fast-paced. To help students to keep up with it, a Forum is setup on the course OWL page. All questions related to the course material should be posted there, and online discussions are encouraged.

HOMEWORK: All homework will be collected online <u>at least once a week</u>. There will be two types of assignments: WebWork sets and through OWL. WebWork assignments will require separate login to the following page: https://webwork1.stats.uwo.ca/webwork2/Calc1301-Sec001-2020/. WebWork assignments are individualized and should be submitted through the WebWork interface. The other type of assignments is to be submitted through OWL. These assignments should be either typed or completed on paper and then scanned into a single PDF file. The file then should be uploaded through the OWL interface.

Note that all homework deadlines are controlled by computer and therefore are strict!

EXAMS: There will be a midterm on **July 24, 10 AM–12 PM**. The Final will be on August 17 or 18, TBA. All exams will be given online and controlled by *Proctortrack*. Below is important information concerning online exams:
