Mathematics 1700B, Winter 2025, Linear Algebra I for the Mathematical Sciences, XXX, three 1h tutorials Thu between 11:30am and 2:30pm, XXX.

One of Mathematics 1120A/B (recommended), Calculus 1000A/B or Calculus 1500A/B with a minimum mark of 70% in the case of Calculus 1000A/B or Calculus 1500A/B.

3. Course Syllabus, Schedule, Delivery Mode

Syllabus: An enriched version of Mathematics 1600A/B. Complex numbers and the integers modulo a prime; vectors, lines, planes; solving linear systems; spanning sets and linear independence; matrix algebra; elementary matrices; subspaces, bases, dimension and rank; introduction to linear transformations; determinants; eigenvalues and eigenvectors; similarity and diagonalization; Markov chains and other applications.

At a successful completion of the course, a student will be able to

- solve computational problems (that may or may not have been discussed in the course),
- state important definitions and results from the course in a precise way
- decide whether statements about the course material are true or false
- present written answers in a complete, correct and well-structured way, using correct notation.

Contingency plan

Students are welcome to purchase second-hand or earlier editions of this textbook. However, all references to the book (including exercises) made in this course will refer to the custom edition mentioned above. Students with different textbook versions have to translate this on their own for their editions.

5. Methods of Evaluation

Grading Scheme and Assessment Dates

The overall course grade will be calculated as listed below:

Tutorial Participation 10%

Midterm Tests (2) 25% each, 50% in total

Final Exam 40%

There will be weekly homework assignments. These assignments will be graded, but the grade only serves as a feedback to the student, without affecting the final grade for the course. To receive feedback, a student must upload his or her solution to Gradescope before the deadline.

Graded assignments will be discussed during the tutorials. Students can volunteer to present their solution on the board. The "tutorial participation" mark refers to this and to in-class discussions during the tutorial. In particular, if a student never presents on the board and never participates in a discussion, then the participation mark is 0%.

Depending on the class size, the final exam with be either oral (20min) or written. This will be announced at the start of the semester.

Evaluation Scheme for Missed Assessments

There are no extensions for any assessment. The weight of any missed assessment will be transferred to the final exam. If homework is uploaded to Gradescope after the deadline, then the student will not receive any feedback.

When a student misses the Final Exam and their Academic Consideration has been granted, they will be allowed to write the Special Examination (the name given by the University to a makeup Final Exam). See the Academic Calendar for details (under <u>Special Examinations</u>), especially for those who miss multiple final exams within one examination period.

Essential Learning Requirements

Even when Academic Considerations are granted for missed coursework, the following are deemed essential to earn a passing grade:

• a minimum grade of 45% on the final exam. If this requirement is not met, the final grade cannot exceed 49%.
